

Fire Alarm System

Required by the Fire Code, the improvements to the fire alarm system— also known as the "audibility upgrades"—will begin in mid- to late-January.

This extensive work will bring our building up to code with the alarms being heard in each unit at legally required levels.

The contractors will be installing a fire alarm in each unit, over the door from the hallway. External to each unit, cables will extend along the hallway corridors where the walls meet the ceiling. These external wires will be covered with crown moulding.

This work will include the dismantling of the "Xtendalarm" (also known as "Secutron") in each unit. When the Xtendalarm is dismantled, the wiring will be tied off to ensure safety. The contractor will also repair and plaster over the spot where the Xtendalarm was. It will be the responsibility of individual unit owners to re-paint or repaper their wall as they wish. If any owner wants the Xtendalarm replaced as a coverup, the owner must notify the office in writing and then that will be possible.

We expect this project's overall cost to be substantially less than the budgeted amount of \$500,000 in the reserve plan.

Information Meeting for Owners

Owners are encouraged to attend an open meeting with the Board of Directors on the 2012 Budget and Other Topics.

Mostly this will be a "questions and answers" and discussion meeting for residents to bring up topics of interest to them.

Update on Landscaping Plan

Thank you to everyone who attended the landscape plan meeting and provided feedback. In the spring the Board will be proceeding with the 2nd phase of the plan with the planting/redesign of the two large "island" planting areas on either side of the main entry walkway. Existing shrubs will be pruned/ transplanted as required, beds will be adjusted in size and shape, an arrangement of perennials will be installed and ground covers and small flowering trees



will be added to accentuate the front. New plants will include hosta, pachysandra, tri-color hydrangea, peony, black-eyed susans, ligularia, a variety of ornamental grasses and autumn

joy sedum.

As well, if quotes come in on budget, we will complete Area 6 which is along the iron fence and underneath existing pine trees. This project will include 1) extending the garden bed that is now in Area 5 (where the cedar trees are) to the north to better frame and enhance the building perimeter; 2) reducing lawn area and mulching beneath pines for both appearance and moisture retention. We have also decided to lift ourselves out of the winter doldrums by introducing some spring bulbs. Hyacinth and fritellaria have been planted in the octagonal planter and tight groupings of narcissus will appear in the raised bed to the right of the front entrance. The criteria used in selecting these spots included avoiding areas that we

would be later digging up (and therefore wasting the plants) during future phases of implementing the landscape plan and keeping away from shaded areas since the bulbs wouldn't survive over time. We also



excluded bulbs, such as tulips, that our squirrel friends find too yummy to resist! In the coming years, we plan to plant bulbs in other spots in the back and front to add a burst of early spring colour.

She was a prominent resident of 40 Homewood and took part in many of the volunteer services here.
