
With so many of us living such busy lives, there is nothing more valuable to families than spending time together.

# Recycling Corner **EXCITING NEWS!**

### 40 Homewood has a new Green Committee

Our Purpose is: To encourage residents of 40 Homewood to reduce waste and energy consumption and to significantly increase the ways we contribute to helping the environment

#### Why do we need a new Green Committee?

- Recycling is good for the environment and saves us money too. The city charges us for each of the
  garbage bins (*Brown bins*) we require, but there is <u>no charge</u> for the recycling bins (*Blue bins*). So, the
  more we recycle the less garbage bins we need and our costs go down. Good deal!
- The cost of garbage pickup has increased from under \$4,000 last year to almost \$42,000 in 2009
- · Increasing our recyclables and reducing electricity consumption keeps our condo fees low
- We want to do all we possibly can to help the environment

Over the next few months we will roll-out details. We'll want to accomplish much in the next year. Here are just a few of the details:

- Decreasing brown bin garbage collection from <u>8 bins per week</u> to <u>6 bins per week</u> by August 31, 2009!
- Introducing Green Bins to the building
- Significantly decreasing electricity consumption
- Increased proper disposal of toxic waste

### How will we accomplish this?

- New Recycling Cards will be handed out soon! (we can now recycle more than we could before you'll hear more about this soon)
- We'll hold Informational Evenings in the Recreation Room
- We'll make it easier to recycle toxic waste (batteries, fluorescent bulbs, paint etc.)
- You'll receive tips on reducing waste and energy consumption and using environmentally friendly cleaning products

We will communicate information to you in a number of ways – Channel 13, this newsletter, displays in the lobby, events in the Rec Room, the bulletin board by the mailroom, on the elevators and on the 40 Homewood website

In the meantime, don't forget to take your old batteries down to the Management Office for proper disposal
