

#### Laundry Room

The Board has approved the upgrading of our laundry room.

Management will be purchasing 20 new washers and 20 new dryers. There will be 4 top load washers and 16 front load washers and 10 double stacked dryers. As well, the walls will be painted. There will be more folding space than there is at present.

We will be switching from the token system to a card system. Each unit will be given a card to use on the machines. You can load and recharge your payment card from Visa, Master Card and Debit card or use cash.

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Please Note The Difference

In the green bin for your organic waste, your deposits should be <u>in a</u> <u>plastic bag</u>, (such as a grocery bag, a produce bag, a bread bag or a milk bag) which has been tied once, no twist tie.

In your blue bins, for your recycling, your deposits should be <u>loose (not in bags).</u>

If your unit has not received the information on the organic waste program in our building, plus a kitchen bin for holding your organic waste, plus a new blue recycling bag with updated recycling information, please go to the office and sign for this package.

The more waste that we can divert to the blue bins and the green bins, the lower will be our costs for garbage collection.

#### President's report By Chris Lambert

I want to share with you some very interesting initiatives that your Board is moving forward on that will make a positive difference to our home.

We now have financial reports up to the end of February. These reports will be put in the library for your convenience. Please remember they are not audited so there will be some adjustments at year-end. It's important for you to see what the Board sees. We have discovered an error in last year's monthly financial statements. The "accumulated surplus (beginning of year)" line item includes over \$100,000 for the value of satellite and energy equipment. The 2007 audited financial statements correctly separate the surplus and equipment value. We now have professionally designated accountants for our financial statements so the reports will present an accurate picture.

Our financial situation has stabilized and is improving. Although our accumulated surplus is lower than previously thought there is no need to change our strategy; we will continue to control costs and look for savings in our operations.

The Board is exploring potential savings in utilities costs. An energy audit, in conjunction with an updated reserve fund study, has been approved. Over the next several weeks, engineers will inspect our building envelope and systems to assess their condition and timelines for replacement. The energy audit will reveal the best opportunities we have to decrease our utility costs.

We are moving forward with refurbishment of our laundry room. The new machines will help improve our savings by using less water and electricity. We will try to minimize the inconvenience to you during renovations. We expect the new laundry room to be complete in the next few months.

The new indoor recycling room will is now open and that will make it even easier to

recycle. The City charges us for regular garbage pick-up, while blue bin and green bin pick-up is free. We are fortunate to have been among the first in our area to have City pick-up of organic waste in our new green bins. Thanks go our Green Committee for organizing the green bin rollout and to Brookfield for their sound advice and support. Please remember that the more you recycle, the more we save on garbage pick-up fees!

We had three owners' meetings in March. The first was March 19 when we had a guest speaker, Mr. Gerry Martell from the City of Toronto to talk to us about the green bins. The green team distributed kitchen bins and blue recycling bags. The second was held on March 23 to discuss updating our rules, and the Board took resident's questions at the third on March 31. Thanks to all who attended and gave your input, listened to your neighbours and helped make this a better community.

I continue to be amazed at the dedication, energy and talents of so many volunteers. The new bylaws team has been working since August to update our 1972-vintage bylaws and align the governance of our corporation with the new Condominium Act and current industry practices. We've had some very interesting discussions and excellent ideas from owners, team members and participants. We all have a stake in good governance of our corporation. I think the bylaws that will be presented to owners in June will be robust, easy to understand and, most of all, fair to everyone. Our next owners' meeting will be on Wednesday April 15 where we will discuss corporation powers and revisit some issues that have been raised in previous meetings.

The social committee now has Board approval to move forward with some new kinds of events. Thanks to the volunteers on this committee, we look forward to hearing more about them in the coming weeks.

I wish all of you a pleasant spring and hope you can all get outside to enjoy the fine weather.

#### WAYS TO SAVE WATER INDOORS



• Do not put water down

the drain that could be used for watering a plant or for cleaning.

• Check for leaks in your toilet or faucets and repair where necessary.

• Use the green bins instead of the toilet for disposing of tissues and other trash.

• Take shorter showers or replace your showerhead with a water-efficient version.

• Turn the tap off when brushing your teeth or shaving.

• Operate automatic dishwaters and washing machines when they are fully loaded or use the appropriate water setting.

• Do not use running water to thaw meat. Defrost food overnight in the refrigerator.
