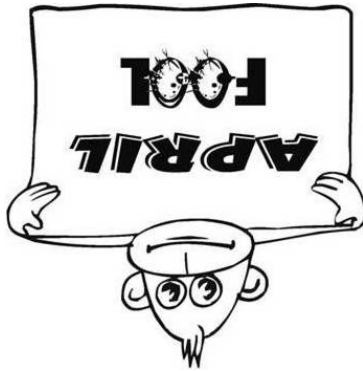

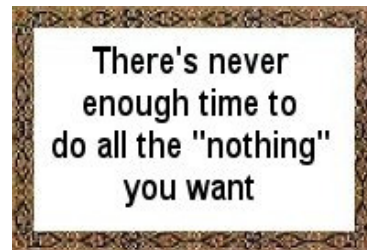

With her sweetness, day by day

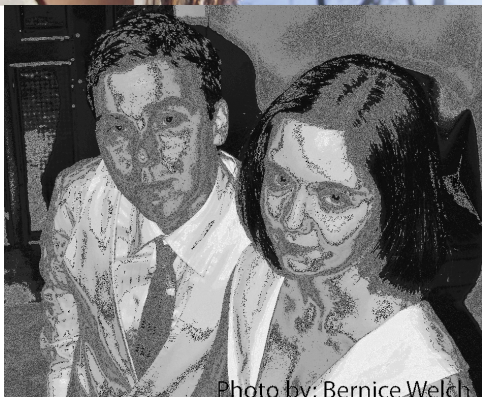
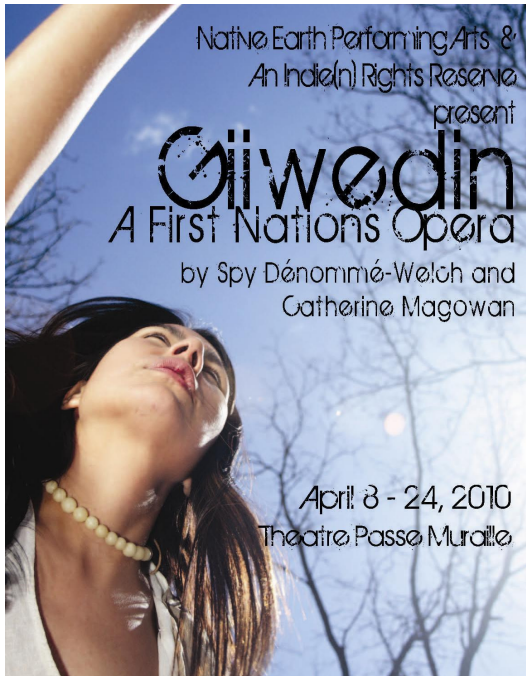

held on Sunday, March 14 in the Recreation Room was attended by over 40 residents. It was a happy evening.

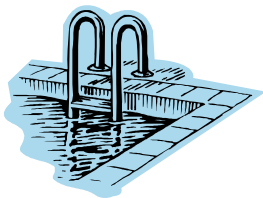

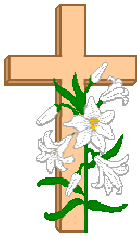

### Common Element/Special Assessment Payments

This is a reminder that your monthly common element payments are due and owing on the first day of each and other month. If you have not yet made arrangement to pay your Special Assessment please do so as it was owing and due by January 31, 2010. Please note – The Corporation reserves the right to place a Lien on you unit for non-payment of the Common Expenses and Special Assessment. This will include any legal costs associated with registering the Lien.

### Package Delivery

If you are expecting a delivery via courier and will not be home please inform the Office.

### Locker Room Storage

We have observed many lockers whose contents are piled so high within the locker that the contents almost reach the ceiling. There is a sprinkler system in each Locker Room and the Fire Code states there must be a minimum clearance of 16 inches between the bottom of the sprinkler head and the contents of the locker. Please ensure that any goods stored within your

locker have the minimum clearance, as stated above.
