# Explanation why Generator Shut Down During Blackout

It has been determined the reason we lost the generator during the blackout was the 34° temperature during the day and the lilac bushes surrounding the air intake and outlet created a canopy/umbrella over the vent, causing the generator to inhale its own exhaust. The excessive heat caused the generator to overheat. Corrective measures are being taken to avoid this in the future.

#### Gardens


