





My name is James Lee. I live here at 40 Homewood and am writing about the organization I work with. I am the Programs and Services Coordinator for ACCES Employment Services - Toronto. We're a community-based, non-profit employment agency serving unemployed and under-employed adults, and are located at the corner of Bathurst and College. We are now in our 21st year of operation. We offer a wide range of free employment services, including workshops, employment counselling, conversational English classes, job development, employment events, job fairs etc. We also have a Resource Centre with computers, books on resume writing, interview skills, changing careers etc. faxing, photocopying etc. and are open from Monday to Friday. The exact times are listed at the bottom.

We get thousands of clients through our door each year but there is always room for more. It has occurred to me that I have rarely seen anyone from 40 Homewood, so I suspect that residents don't know about our services and that such an organization is located so close to home. I'm sure there must be people who find themselves unemployed or who are looking to change careers and who could use our help. All of our services are completely free (actually, photocopies are 5 cents each), and we are open to anyone whether working or not. We are funded largely by the provincial government, (Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities), but also receive some funding from the federal government, the City of Toronto and the United Way. 
