Happy Summer Everyone!

This month I feature a cafe on Queen West that is both "cheap" and "good" eats. This is "Cafe Crepe" on the Northeast corner of Queen and John.

All day, everyday, for \$4.00 you can get a freshly brewed coffee (hot or iced) with your choice of a butter & sugar, cinnamon & sugar, or lemon & sugar crepe. It comes wrapped in a tight little package to go so you can walk and mow down, or have it on the bar stools by the counter. The crepes are thin yet fluffy, and reminiscent of the ones I had in Paris, which makes only one word come to mind: ...dreamy. I had the butter & sugar. With a judicious balance of both the sugar, which is sprinkled throughout and nicely melted, and the butter, the crepe is neither too sweet nor too buttery. The Italian coffee is made to order and gives Starbucks a run for its money. There is also a bigger selection of sweet and savoury crepes, along with panninis, baguette sandwiches, salads, as well as being fully licensed.

And if you prefer, there is a sit-down dining area in the back, which is great when you want a meal or for date-night. Staff are very friendly and chatty even though I keep getting the "special": the most bang for your buck surely, and totally worth it.

Though Cafe Crepe isn't in our 'hood, if you feel like going for a nice summer evening walk, and with the current PANAM buzz in the air, this is a lovely jaunt with plenty to look at along the way. Summer in this city to me, makes up for the dreary too-long winters, and with this past week's

MAPLE BEEF-BACON DONUTS

From Caplansky's Deli Food Truck

Makes 40 donuts

3/4 cups sugar

1/4 cup melted butter

2 large eggs, whole

1 egg yolk

2 1/4 cups flour

1/2 tsp baking soda 1 tbsp baking powder

½ tsp salt
½ tsp nutmeg
1 cup buttermilk

3/4 cup beef bacon (or your

favourite type), minced

lcing sugar Maple syrup

In mixing bowl, beat together sugar and butter until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs and set aside. In large separate bowl, stir together flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt and nutmeg. Add sugar mixture to flour mixture, then add buttermilk until you get a thick (but not too thick) batter. Toss in minced bacon and mix until well combined. Refrigerate for at least one hour. Dust work surface with flour. Using a small ice cream scoop, scoop ball of batter and roll on surface into small uniform balls. Drop in oil and cook until golden or dark brown and cooked through. Dust with icing sugar and drizzle with maple syrup. Can be made ahead and served at room temperature. 2

Water and Balconies

Summer is finally here, and with it, the annual ritual of setting up the balcony and planting flowers and shrubs.

Every year we receive multiple complaints about water dripping from a balcony on a higher floor.

Here are a few tips to minimize the complaints:

 Please do not overwater your plants, especially plants hanging from the balcony railings.

Note: planters hung from balconies are permitted where the plants are on the INSIDE of the balcony railing. Planters that hang on the OUTSIDE of the railing or on TOP of the railing are NOT permitted.

- Please use drip trays under potted plants to trap excess water and assist with keeping the roots and soil damp, reducing the need for watering.
- For hanging plants, please take them down to water them, ideally above a potted plant, so the excess water will not be drained off the balcony gutter.
- Silk plants and shrubs are a great alternative, especially for the west side of the building where the sun is much more intense and extra watering is needed.

Residents who have installed split-type ductless air conditioning units are kindly asked to refrain from venting the water through the balcony gutters. Please drain them into a nearby planter or a bucket which can be periodically emptied in the sink or tub.

Short-Term Rentals

There seems to be some confusion about the leasing of units by owners.

Recently, a few units in our building showed up on websites like AirBnB and Kijiji offering short-term rentals during the Pan Am Games.

According to the regulations in the current Condominium Act:

Leasing or letting for transient use

83.1 (1) No owner of a unit shall lease or otherwise let a unit or permit a unit to be subleased or otherwise sublet for transient use unless the declaration of the corporation contains express authority to permit transient use.

Term of lease

(2) Except where there is a declaration expressly authorizing transient use, the minimum term of a lease of a unit shall be one year.

Notice

- (3) If a declaration expressly authorizes transient use and there is a lease for a term of less than one year, any notice required under subsection 83 (1) shall be given by the earlier of,
- (a) seven days after the unit is leased or the lease is terminated, as the case may be; and
- (b) the beginning of any new lease.

Definition

(4) In this section,

"transient use" means more than one short-term use or occupancy of a particular unit for a period of less than six months in any period of 12 consecutive months.

What this means from a legal perspective is that rentals for a term of less than six(6) months are NOT permitted.

Recently, we published an article in the Newsletter concerning the upcoming changes to the Condominium Act

One of the changes that will almost certainly be included is to change the minimum of six months to twelve (12) months.

We would also like to remind residents who currently lease their units or are considering leasing, that a proper lease must be signed by the Lessee and a copy of the lease provided to the office.

The situation in terms of roommates is less clear. Without a proper signed leasing agreement, the roommate has no protection under the Residential Tenancies Act (RTA)

Several cases involving roommates have landed in the judicial court system, and the courts have taken the position of asking what is "reasonable" in each case.

Just because a tenant does not have the protection of the *Residential Tenancies Act* does not give the landlord (unit owner) carte blanche to do what they like to that tenant.

If you find yourself needing to evict a non-RTA covered tenant from your property, you will find that the Ontario Landlord and Tenant Board will not assist you. Your only remedy is to see if the Police will help you in removing the roommate or boarder from the premises and if not, you are left with applying to the Court for a Writ of Possession to be enforced by the Court Enforcement Office (i.e. the Sheriff).

On a lighter note, guests are always permitted and there is no restriction on the amount of time a household guest can stay.

Bear in mind that guests and roommates do not have the right to go to the office and request things like laundry cards, resident parking permits, bicycle spots, or fobs. These must be purchased, if required, by the unit owner, and the rules regarding the number of fobs per unit remain in place.

While these rules and regulations may seem at first glance to be restrictive, they are in place to assure the peaceful and secure enjoyment of the building and its amenities by all residents.
