Some residents will have natural ("real") Christmas trees for the festive season.



Happy Holidays Fellow Homeys!

Keeping in the festive mood I take you to the Distillery District's themed German Christmas market, on till December 20th.

Something to bear in mind, is that from Friday-Sunday, they are now charging \$5 admission. So we went on a Thursday and it was free. This place is busy! With kiosks selling everything from cheeses to trinkets and poutine, it really puts you in the holiday spirit. And if that doesn't do it, then perhaps the decorated massive Christmas tree in the centre? It is quite stunning, and for the kiddies, or young-at-heart, there is also a ferris wheel behind the tree by Balzac's coffee house.

As this place gets packed and we went around 7pm I wasn't sure if we could have dinner anywhere without waiting at least an hour. So without reservations, we did find a table for 2 at 'Spirits Oyster Bar'. A bustling restaurant with blue pendant lighting, oyster bar, booths, and table dining, the place captures the DD feel for sure. The floors boards, I'm pretty sure, are relics from when it was an actual distillery. Lots of history here, if that interests you.

For dinner, I had the lobster and mushroom paparadelle pasta with truffle (sorry no pic..ate too fast). It is not overpowering though, as sometimes truffle can be. It takes a skilled and deft hand to add just the right amount and not too much. And at Spirits, it was perfect! Paparadelle is the wider noodle so it captures all that saucy goodness with chunks of lobster meat and mushroom. Entrees come with a basket of warmed rolls, and whipped butter, which were perfect for sopping up some of the sauce (which I never do, but that was how yummy it was!)

We were seated in the middle at the tables, and if I were bigger in any way, I'd have felt like an elephant in a china shop, as they say. But we did get in without rez and the meal was incredible! At under \$30 a plate, it is a bit of a splurge, but if celebrating or in a festive mood, or for something different, this could be it. And if you do happen to stroll down to the DD, you may also want to catch some "mulled wine"...a hot concoction of wine, cloves, and other spices, it was a nice boozy treat as you walk around feeling the youthful and energetic buzz in the air. There are some semi-protected seating areas, but you have to stay in the cordoned off areas so make sure you choose a place that you want to stand or sit around in till you finish. When we went, it was still quite warm, but as the cold is here now, you may want to bundle up, because you really can't count on getting a seat anywhere.

Still worth it though!
