

Independent Retirement Living

In June 2011, 92.1% of the 5 million people aged 65 and over in Canada lived in private households. Only 7.9% lived

in retirement residences or long term care facilities, according to Statistics Canada. Living in your own home as a senior requires solid financial planning and good health. It is also very important to keep the home safe to prevent falls. Common mistakes are scattered carpets and long electrical extension cords, which pose a trip and fall hazard. Low lighting can reduce the visibility. If you have mobility problems, you can have railings installed on both sides of staircases and also grab bars in the bathrooms.

A panic button to alert a monitoring centre that you need help is also a good idea, especially if you live alone.

Seniors typically need the most support in their homes, when they are in their 80s and 90s. They may be dealing with several chronic conditions and they may be on multiple medications. If a senior can no longer cook a meal, services can be arranged to bring in frozen or fresh dinners every day through private or volunteer services in the community.

Cleaning services, personal services and housekeeping services can all be arranged, but you might have to pay for some of it.

A few residents are storing items in large bulk containers and/or shelves on their balconies. Please be reminded that such bins are not permitted to be visible over the height of the balcony railing. If you have bins stacked on your balcony above the railing, please remove such bins or shelves immediately.

It goes without saying that we are constantly reminding residents not to throw anything off of their balcony, yet every year we are plagued with complaints of

over-watering, cigarette butts, lighters, leaves, papers, books, umbrellas and occasionally something much more dangerous. This is potentially life-threatening for anyone below, and we are strongly advising people to please be vigilant and do not throw ANYTHING over the balcony railing.

Last year I joined a support group for procrastinators. We still haven't met yet.


When I was a child I thought "Nap Time" was a punishment. Now, as a grownup, it feels like a small vacation.

Happy Happy June Everyone!!

It's been slow to start but feels like we are in full spring swing now folks! Which means, the time for getting "out and about" is here!

So this month, I simply take us up the road to a place I'm pretty sure many of you have gone to: Loblaws at Maple Leaf Gardens. I will offer you my top picks of yummy delights, all within a super quick walk.

First of all, it isn't 'Iron Chef" fare, but honestly, who cares? Especially when you have so much choice from AM - PM that is open 364 days of the year. And, being 3 blocks away, it couldn't get more convenient, really. I will select one appetizer, one salad, a main, and a dessert.

For the appetizer, I choose the shrimp dumplings at the T&T sushi bar near the escalators. For \$5.99 you get 6 dumplings stuffed full with shrimp...not bad at all. They are much better heated in the microwave. I've been to many Chinese tea houses, or "Cha-Lau" and these "ha-gow" are as good as any.

My favourite salad there, and there are so many to choose from, has to be their riff on a Nicoise, with seared tuna, boiled egg, olives, green beans, cherry tomatoes, and new potatoes. At \$7.99 this is a salad that eats like a meal. All components are presented separately so once I open it I mix them all up with a drizzle of the balsamic dressing it comes with. The greens are a tender mesclun mix which suits the subtle flavours of the rest of the salad.

And for the main, I choose the grilled salmon fillet in teriyaki sauce with a small side of bok choy (see pic). At \$8.99 this is not a steal, and it needs to be said that it only went up in price very recently; it used to be a dollar less. What is consistently impressive about this entree though, is that the fish is always grilled to perfection; never underdone or overdone. I recommend that you eat this one cold or slightly


warmed. Nothing worse than having to eat dried and chewy over-cooked fish.

And finally, for dessert, I choose what I could call a 'snow eclair' (price?) and they don't always have them. Shaped like a hot dog bun of deep fried dough (what could be better, right?), whipped cream is piped into the centre and it is finished off with a dusting of confectioners sugar. With a cup of coffee, this dessert is the perfect end to a meal that is reasonably priced and convenient beyond belief. What a lovely addition to our neighbourhood.

Seating is available between the deli and salad bar. There is also additional seating by the windows near the cafe. And there is even more seating on the second floor just outside the LCBO. I have gone there to do work before and have to admit, I don't do it anymore. I don't think it is the safest place, and if you are staying for awhile and are alone, you'll have to bring everything with you when you are going to the washroom. Or better yet, take it all to go, as it is designed to be so, and have an impromptu picnic in Allan Gardens, enjoying the sunshine!

Ambience of the dining experience at Loblaws is not what this is about, and the odd character (s) you will see, but I would still say, amidst the buzz of downtown Toronto, this is truly a good eat, sort of a cheap eat, and definitely a sweet spot to boot.





Windows, Windows, Windows

The Board of Directors would like to take this opportunity to follow-up on the owners meeting on May 18 and the subsequent survey sent out.

A very big thanks to the many residents who attended the meeting. It was a very lively discussion and while emotions ran high at times, the Board members and property manager were very pleased with the discussion and the issues the meeting raised.

Please be reassured that this was the first meeting regarding the window replacement project. The survey that followed was simply that, a means for the Board to gauge the populist sentiment and take the results into consideration when meeting with the engineers to address the issues and concerns that were raised and to guide us in the ongoing negotiations with the engineering firm.

The survey was never intended to be a formal members vote. Some have argued that non-resident owners were not included, and that tenants were included. The survey was emailed as well in order to provide it to non-resident

owners. We felt that the more opinions we can gather, the better to guide our conversation as the project advances.

While the meeting raised more questions than it answered, the Board and management see this as a very positive first step. Your questions and comments provide extremely valuable input.

For example, the issue of floor-to-ceiling windows is of concern to many residents. It has been pointed out to us that all the new buildings in the city have them. While that is true, all of the new buildings have central air, which puts us in the unenviable position of trying to satisfy the desires of those who want full-length windows against the desires of those who want the option for window air conditioners and those who wish to either maintain or obtain the ability to open the window for fresh air. It is a complicated issue and tough decisions will have to be made.

As stated in the meeting, at this point, we have engaged the engineering firm to oversee the entire project. There has been no date set for the window replacement to begin. We are still in the very preliminary stages of the project.

Your Board of Directors is always doing our best to balance the needs and wants of the residents with what is best for the building.

We trust that this letter will ease some of your concerns. Please continue to provide us with your comments, questions and suggestions.

Window Air-Conditioner s

If you are getting ready to install your window air-

conditioner or are in the market for a new one please keep in mind the following tips;

Buy an Energy-Efficient Air Conditioner

Air conditioners use energy to cool your apartment and reduce humidity levels. A correctly sized, energy-efficient model saves energy and money. Air conditioners have an energy efficiency rating — EER for short. Buy an air conditioner with an EER of at least 11 and an ENERGY STAR® symbol on the product. Although they usually cost a little more, you will use less electricity. Higher-efficiency air conditioners are usually higher quality, less noisy and better performing.

Ensure the air conditioner has the correct amount of cooling for your apartment. An air conditioner with too much cooling capacity will not operate efficiently, can cause your apartment to feel cold and humid, will use more energy and will cost more to operate. For apartments, smaller air conditioners are always better as they will run more efficiently and provide superior temperature and humidity control. Change or wash your AC filters monthly. This will greatly improve the air quality in your apartment.

Reduce Air Leakage

Most air conditioners come with an accordion-shaped piece of plastic which should be used in the space left when the window is opened. If you don't have this or it has been worn, visit a hardware store and have a piece of plexiglass cut to size. Dudley's Hardware on Church Street no longer cuts plexiglass, but check RONA, Home Hardware, The Home Depot or any other large hardware store. Do not leave the space open as you'll be letting the cool air out and the warm air in!

Seal joints around through-wall or window-mount air-conditioning units. Use caulking or spray-in foam. If the joint is wider than 3 mm (1/8 in.), a foam backer-rod may be inserted in the joint first to prevent the caulking from flowing into the joint. Be careful not to block pipes or openings intended to drain condensation from the air conditioner outdoors.

Please do not leave the air conditioner on all day if you are away.
