Happy September All!

To some beach bums out there, like me, the fall can be a bit of a letdown...but I've decided that it can also be the start of something great! So this month, I take you out of Toronto, and share with you a deal that begins Sept.5-Oct.10 between Sunday-Thursday, holidays excluded (1-905-356-1333)

For those of you who need an excuse to get out of the city, and are looking for an affordable totally fun getaway try: the Holiday Inn in Niagara Falls! This Holiday Inn is centrally located across from Fallsview Casino and for \$105/per person for one night, here's what you get: one dinner atop the Skylon Tower (which revolves offering you a splendid view of the falls and surrounding area), one breakfast at Coco's Steakhouse (in the hotel), and free parking. Do the math folks: it's an incredible deal. An added plus that it has indoor/outdoor pools.

For the dinner, you make reservations at the Holiday Inn front desk. It is a pre-fixe menu, and I chose the French Onion soup which was spot on: just the right amount of saltiness with sherry, Gruyere cheese, and a slice of baguette. I had this in the middle of summer but in an air conditioned restaurant and after a long day of walking, it was just what my body craved. For my main I had the salmon fillet with potato and vegetable. A word about the serving size: huge! I spoke with our server and she said she believes it has to do with our proximity to the border: American size servings. For me, it

was far too bia (see pic) but one thing is for sure: you will not leave hungry! The salmon with a lemon/butter sauce was a bit overcooked, but the vegetables were done right. The grilled tomato with a sprinkling of bread crumbs added a nice nostalaic touch to the dish. For dessert I had the maple ice cream. Brent had the steak (see pic) for his main, grilled to order and his helping of vegetable seemed even bigger than mine with almost a whole broccoli floret! He always finishes his plate, but this time, even he left something...For dessert he chose the Black Forest cake, but said my ice cream was better. But by that time, we were both too stuffed anyway with barely enough energy to roll back to the hotel. And this is really the bonus: the Skylon Tower is just a short walk behind the hotel. And in this case, as in most, location is everything.

The ambience is romantic with the restaurant making one complete revolution every hour; think of it as a mini CN Tower. And at night, the falls are alight in a rainbow of colours. You also get a view of the impressive Fallsview Casino, which changes colours at night too. Being so close to the casino is convenient, not only because of the gambling, but because you can wander into the games room and head straight to the back lounge where, on the night we were there, had a live band playing. There are also all kinds of shops and cafes on the main level. So even if it is after hours, it is still a nice place to walk around and get lost in for a bit. There is a gorgeous roof top bar/lounge but was closed by the time we made it up there.

Breakfast the next morning was quite standard fare with bacon, eggs and coffee. You can pay a tad more and have the breakfast buffet which is better since they don't have a vegetarian option. The buffet is not extensive but is more than you could ask for with scrambled eggs, muffins, pancakes, sausage, bacon, home fries, cereal selection, and fresh fruit salad.

We are fortunate to be so close to the falls, because no matter what season it is, they

never fail to delight and inspire awe in the child in us all. I urge you to go if you haven't gone in awhile. It will surely put a smile on your face! And really, as temperatures change, who doesn't need that?
