Door Remote Control Update

How to Get Started with Organics

For almost a year, the building has been working collaboratively with the Toronto Environmental Alliance (TEA) to improve waste diversion. TEA performed a garbage audit last February. We discovered that 50% of our garbage could actually be diverted to organics. By increasing our efforts to do organics as a building, we can reduce our garbage costs and do something to help the environment. It's a win-win.

If you've wanted to do organics, but didn't know how to start, please read the pointers below. If you're already doing organics, thank you! Please review the tips in case something has changed in the process.

Organics go in the large green bin in the recycling room, next to the recycling bins.

How do I get started?

The best place to start is to have a place ready to collect organics. Here are some options:

- Get a kitchen catcher from the office. It's a small plastic tub that you can line with a plastic bag to collect your organics.
- Keep a small container on your counter (e.g., yogurt container) to collect organics throughout the day. Dump it into a bag, or kitchen catcher, as needed.
- Use a grocery bag. Make sure it doesn't have holes or tears in it.

What is accepted?

The organics bin accepts more than you think! Here is a partial list of what's accepted.

- All food scraps, even the parts you don't eat like the ends of carrots and bones.
- All pet waste and bedding.
- Soiled cardboard (greasy pizza boxes) and cardboard ice cream cartons.
- Diapers, sanitary napkins, etc.
- Tissues and paper towels that do not have chemicals or cleaners on them.

What is not accepted?

- Hair and nail clippings.
- Plastic, metal, clothing, hazardous materials, wax paper.
- When in doubt, go to the Toronto Waste Wizard to check it out.

What about the smell and fruit flies? Since organics is likely to be wet garbage and may get stinky fast, here are some options.

- Make sure your container to collect organics has a tight fitting lid.
- Store your organics in the fridge or freezer until you have enough to dump it.
- Take it out often.

Tips

Tie the plastic bag loosely. During processing, the plastic bags open causing the bags and organic matter to separate. This is how the plastic bags are collected and removed from the organics stream to eliminate contamination.

Use regular grocery bags to line kitchen catchers or collect organics. Do NOT use compostable plastic bags.

Compostable bags are garbage and contaminate the recycling stream.

What is the 40 Homewood Free Boutique?

A designated place for residents to leave gently used or unused items for others to take. Everything on the table is free

When will it be available? And where is it?

We're aiming to launch the 40 Homewood Free Boutique in mid-January. It will be in the small room with the television next to the laundry rooms, across from the library.

What's accepted at the 40 Homewood Free Boutique?

Presently the following items are accepted at the 40 Homewood Free Boutique:

- Small appliances and electronics, clean and in working order
- Kitchen items (e.g., glassware, plates, mugs, silverware, utensils, pots, etc.)
- Household decorations (aka knick knacks, figurines, tchotchkes, trinkets, lamps, etc.)
- Toys and games

All items must be gently used and in presentable condition with no breaks, cracks, tears, etc.

What's not accepted?

• No textiles, clothing, or cushions/pillows. Items in good

condition can go in the OASIS donation bin, located next to the bulk bin in the rear of the building. Otherwise they go in the garbage for landfill.

- No food or edibles. Food can be brought to Loblaws at Church and Carlton near the cash registers, or your favorite charity.
- E-waste (electronics and small appliances that don't work). These items can be placed in the bright, green bins in the alcove of the recycling room.
- No furniture or plants

What about other donations that are not suitable for the 40 Homewood Free Boutique?

Items in decent condition can be placed in the OASIS bin.
Please note the following items are not accepted in the OASIS bin: No furniture, baby car seats, play pens, cribs, walkers/wheelchairs, bbqs, TVs, computer monitors, mattresses/box springs, large appliances, patio furniture, bicycles, or books.

For broken items, or ones in bad condition, use the specialized waste area located in the alcove of the recycling room for household cleaners, paint, batteries, e-waste, fluorescent light bulbs, cooking oil, etc.
