Do you play Bridge?


We are always looking for bridge players. If you are interested, please come down to the library on Thursdays at 7:00pm and join in an evening of bridge.

Continuing the New Year theme of home and the coziness we get when in the company of loved ones, remains this month's focus. And honestly, the meal that best captures such feelings for me is brunch.

The loved one that I shared probably my favourite meal with is my long-time friend and award-winning novelist Wayson Choy (see pic). We were due for a long catch-up session and decided on an old stand-by...cuz when you know you're in for a long meal you go to places that allow you to linger for hours. Which was exactly what we did.



So we met at The Mad Dog Cafe. Located on Gerrard Street East just west of Carlaw, it is an easy College Streetcar ride away.

I had the Veggie Dog (see pic) which came with two eggs, buttered togst, baked beans, hash browns, sautéed spinach, and grilled tomatoes for \$9.25. What can I say? Everything was great as it usually is. I love hash browns made like "rosti potato". And baked beans, quite frankly, should always come with fried eggs! Such a great flavour combo of the comfort food of slow cooked beans with quickly fried eggs. The spinach could have been sautéed a tad longer and had more seasoning but that's not really a deal-breaker. Be warned too that Mad Dog is a cash-only establishment. The space is small but quaint, sunny, open, and very much a neighbourhood hang-out, with a small patio space out front in the summer.

As we sat and reminisced, talked writing, gratitude, and life in general, we ended up sharing a pastry (sorry no pic — ate too fast). As I walked by the dessert case my eye caught the glazed topping of a pecan square (\$3.50). Pecans were chopped and had a slick sheen that I just had to order it. Having a shortbread crust and just the right amount of sweet without being overly crumbly, this was arguably the BEST pecan square I've had! This alone warrants a trip to Mad Dog. As some of you may know, I don't really have a sweet tooth but I like what I like — and I like this.

Please do not open windows in your unit during the winter months, as this interferes with our radiant heating system and increases the risk of frozen pipes causing damage and insurance claims. Recently, we learned of a situation at another condominium where the resident went away for an extended period of time and left a window open, causing the pipes to freeze and burst, resulting in a major flood of many units. The very expensive cost of repairs was charged back to the unit owner. If you are going to be away for any length of time, please have someone check on your unit regularly and notify the office or security immediately if any problems are found.

This is also a good time to remind all residents to ensure that your unit insurance is up to date and adequate to cover these kinds of events.

Most items that are packaging are recyclable except black plastic. The city requires all plastic containers to be clean, or else it is considered contaminated and the building can be fined.



Questions and Answers to and from the Board and Management

Q. Why have the office hours changed?

A. We have a new property manager and a new site administrator, who require uninterrupted time during the day to complete administrative work. To give them adequate time for their work, the office will close daily from 11:30 a.m until 2:30 p.m.

Q. Why is my ability to use the door entry system not working after Bell Fibe is installed in my unit?

A. The problem is with the Bell technicians. There is a copper wire in the phone jack in every unit that controls the intercom system. If you purchase Bell Fibe, please instruct the installer to leave the copper wire in place and do not disconnect it.

Q. What is the purpose of the room being constructed in the Meeting Room next to the Lobby?

A. This room is being constructed to securely store parcels that have, until now, been delivered to the office. Now that we have 24 hour security, they will take on the task of receiving, storing, and notifying residents of parcels for pick up at the security desk.

Q. Can I book the service elevator over the lunch hour?

A. Yes. Now that we have 24 hour security, deliveries and moves can be arranged during the day, including lunch hour.

Q. Why are we being asked to complete a form to receive electronic notices?

A. This is, in part, due to the new Condominium Act requirements and also because we are upgrading the building management software to accommodate most resident services electronically. Secondarily, this is a Green initiative to reduce the use of paper in the office.

Q. When will the swimming pool be open for use again?

A. We have run into unexpected problems with the pool and are unable to provide a definite date as to when the pool will re-open. Some additional piping needs to be replaced and the pool must be repainted. Once the repairs and painting are completed, the pool will have to be filled with water using a hose (this will take 3 days) and heated before opening for use by residents.

Q. Are we required to have a defibrillator in our building?

A.Yes. The AED (Automated External Defibrillator) has been purchased and will be installed in the lobby. Security, management, cleaners, and board members will be trained in its use.
