Q: Why aren't the security people friendlier when I walk in the lobby?

A: When at their desk, security has to be attentive to many things. They could be watching the numerous

cameras protecting our homes or they might be completing paperwork regarding parcels that have just arrived or picked up. They might be filling out a report or completing a post inspection report for a rental of the party room. When they are not busy with these things they are usually very friendly and engaging. The board is satisfied with the service they give us and we apologize if they sometimes are busy doing other things when residents walk through the front door.

Q: I understand there are changes to the Party Room agreement since the renovations. Can you update me?

bles and chairs that can seat over 100 people and we have improved the television and sound system in the space. Events must end by 1 am and the room must be left in a clean state after each rental before building security can sign off on the room's condition. Please read the terms

> and conditions related to the room rental before filling out your request. Building Link has a blank rental agreement and terms and conditions for viewing room. Please see security to be shown how to connect to the sound system for your event to ensure you know what plugs you might need to connect properly.

Q: The budget contained a line with charges related to garbage rebate – what is that about?

A: This line item is a carryover from when the city did offer a partial garbage rebate. Our accountant advises that this no longer exists for apartments and condos and we regret including this line item in the 2020 budget. No charges will be applied to this line in 2020.

A: For January 1st, 2020 the board has approved the party room rental fee of \$100 per rental. Additionally, a \$500 damage deposit must be left by cheque to cover potential damage that may occur. Booking the room is to be done through Building Link and the payment and deposit must be made within seven days of the booked event. (In 2020 we will explore the possibility to place the deposit and pay the rental fee through credit or debit cards.) Please coordinate your payments with building security for your event as building security is responsible for doing a preevent inspection and a post-event inspection which must be signed off by the renter and security personnel. The space can only be reserved and rented by residents and only one rental event per day is possible. Free guest parking is available until 1am in the building. The room has ta-

Q: How do I know when a parcel arrives for me?

A; As soon as a parcel arrives and building security is ready to put it in the storage closet they scan the unit number on the delivery label and Building Link will pull up the resident's unit and name in the Building Link system. Your profile in Building Link should include instructions on how to notify you of parcels. Building Link will either send out a text or email to you notifying you of your parcel's arrival on-site. If you have two or more residents residing in one unit please ensure each person's Building Link profile allows others to pick up your parcels for you. You can specify this in the notes section of your Building Link profile.
