

If you're looking for date night ambience, look no further than Caffino (1185 King West near Dufferin). Located in a charming refurbished factory warehouse, with high ceilings, chandeliers and giant gilt frames, Caffino has a cute, campy and cool vibe all at the same time.

The bread basket arrives first, with warm toasted slices of bread. Olive oil and balsamic vinegar are on the table to mix as you wish for dipping. I ordered the eggplant parmigiana (\$28). Thin layers of breaded and fried eggplant are doused in marinara, topped with cheese then baked to perfection. Basil sprigs add colour and a much-needed herbaceous kick.

Integrity Care Commitment by Charles Marker

This time around, it's not just a change of management office staff, it's a change to a wholly different property management company. Beginning January 1st, our property management company is ICC. The letters stand for the company's primary values: integrity, care and commitment. ICC is one of the area's biggest condo management firms, with about 250 condos under contract. It is a family company.

Brookfield Residential Services became our property management contractor in late 2008. A few years ago, the name was changed to Crossbridge, but it was still within the Brookfield corporation. In 2023, Crossbridge was bought by FirstService, possibly the largest condo management outfit in North America, but they didn't replace the Crossbridge name until last year.

Reporting to the executive level at ICC is 40 Homewood's new regional manager Mark Daye. Some residents will recognize his name and picture as Mark was our Brookfield site administrator from 2012 to 2013, the position now held by Shane and previously by Amber.

Mark grew up in eastern Ontario (Athens) where he also went to community college, getting a diploma in advertising and public relations. He has worked for marketing, office several firms in general administration, bookkeeping, etc., and then moved to Toronto around the turn of the century.

At his own residence, a condo on Bloor, Mark served on the board of directors for a total of 11 years. This led to a connection to Brookfield and a job at the company. During the time at 40 Homewood, he took the courses necessary to qualify as an RCM (Registered Condominium Manager). He became a property manager within Brookfield and worked at several condos, followed by managing a couple of condos for ICC.



He had been interested in trying another company and finds ICC more flexible and less corporate than he found Crossbridge. He was promoted to a regional manager in 2021 and, in that position, he has four condos under his care. His role is to provide support and assistance to the property managers and site administrators.

Mark has been active in the Green Party of Ontario for some years and was the local candidate in three provincial elections. Currently, he is also on the executive committee of the 13-member board of directors of ACMO, the Association of Condominium Managers of Ontario.

Mark's husband, David, is retired (but young!). Mark has a son, Patrick, who is in his early 30s. Mark is very happy to be working with 40 Homewood again as he has many fond memories of our building and his time here.

Mark has told Martha that 40H is special to him and he'll always be here for us.
